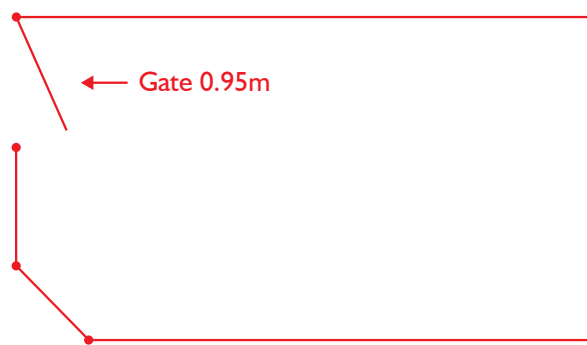


SITE MEASURE GUIDE

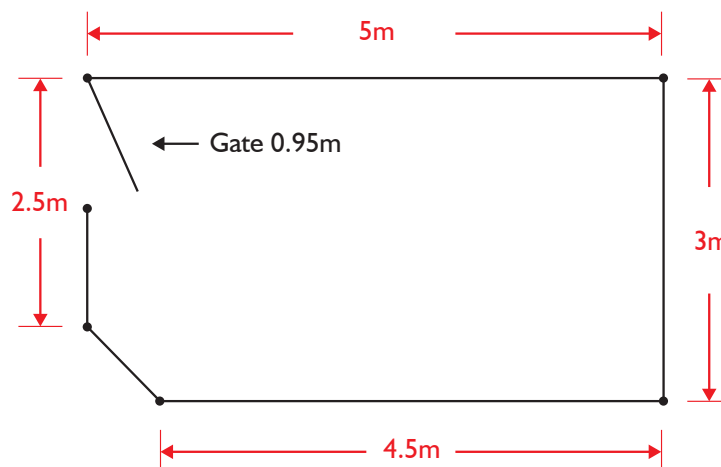
- Open and print off our “Site Measure Form” from the website.
- Fill out all details including the customer name and contact number.
(IMPORTANT - check your local council requirements as to their approved wall heights).

PLAN / TOP VIEW

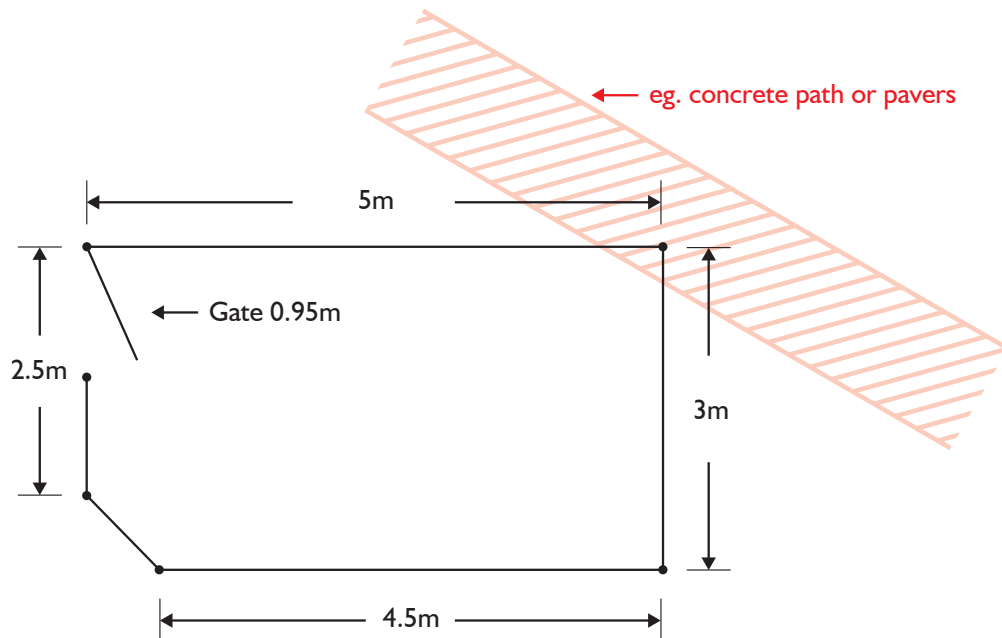
- Sketch on the above form the plan (or top) view of your site, showing the intended wall line (90 and 45 degree corners only) and any gate positions (state the gate width on your drawing in metres – we only offer 0.95 and 1.5m gate widths - 2 gates may be used to create a double width). Use our below suggestion as a guide.



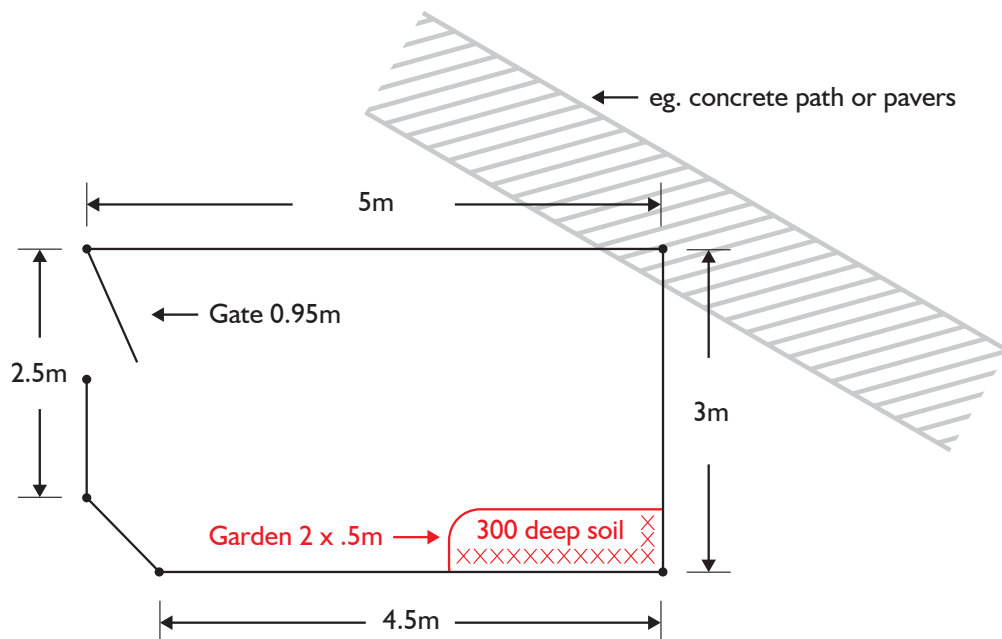
- Measure your **maximum overall dimensions** and mark these on your plan in metres as shown below. (Please ensure your dimensions are within your legal boundary lines).



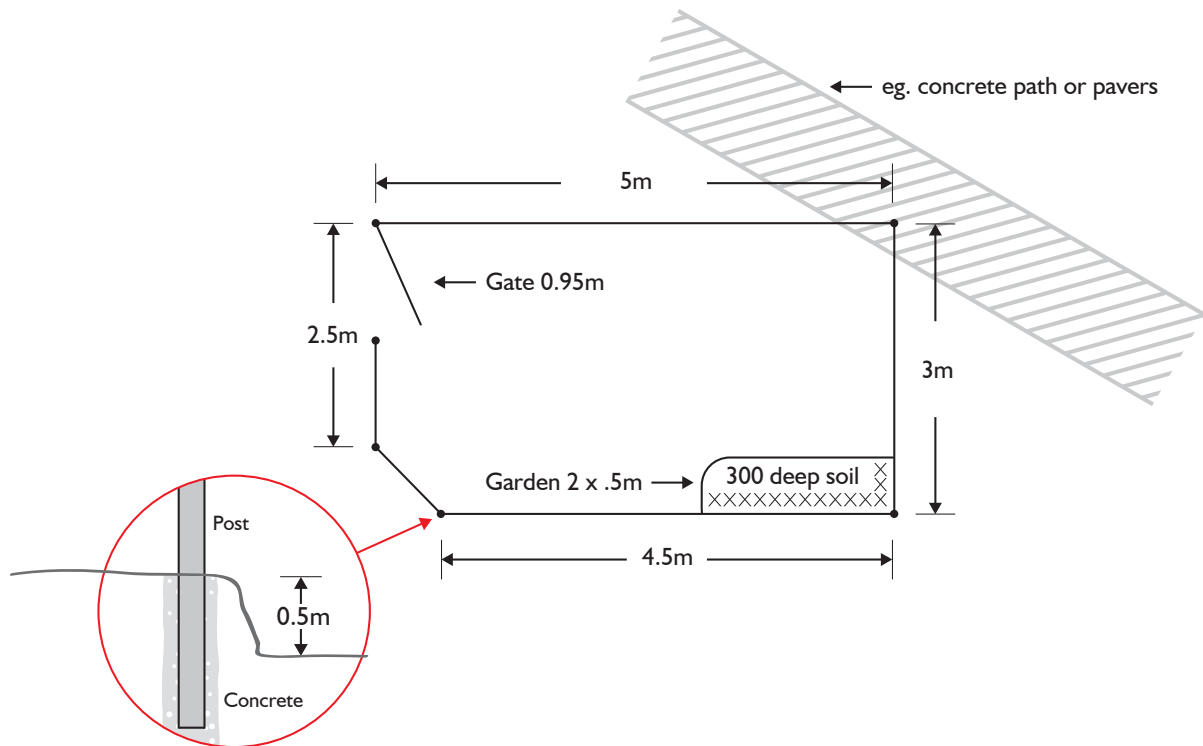
- Mark and dimension any areas of concrete (path / block retaining wall) or other solid objects that may obstruct the post from being concreted into the ground. Use a shaded box and label the item as shown.



- If there is any soil to be retained (up to a maximum depth of 600mm), mark this into your plan with the symbol shown below – include the approx soil depth.



- Clearly note any posts that will be installed alongside a sharp slope or retained soil, marking the height of the drop. (These posts will be supplied longer, to ensure solid footings).

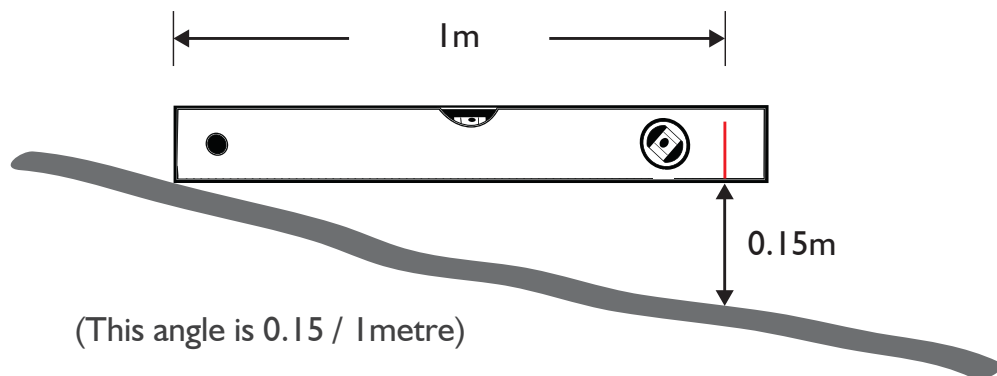


- Show any other important features on your plan, including any streets, gardens, paths or buildings.

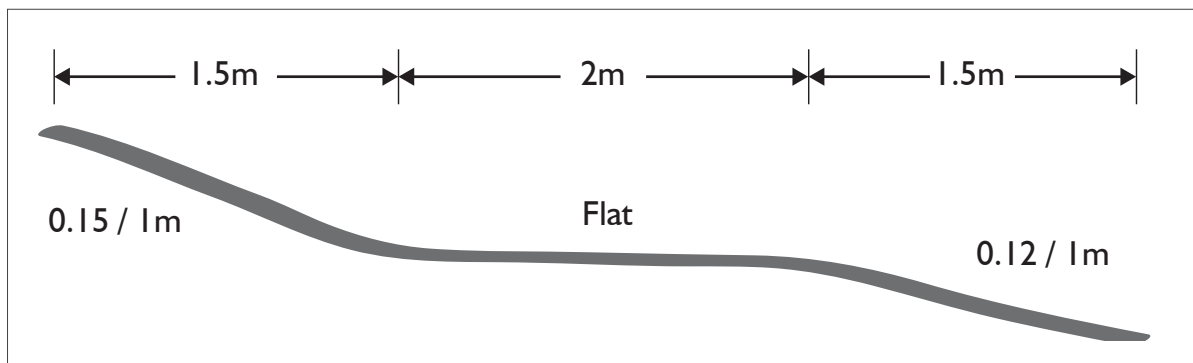


SLOPE OF GROUND

- To measure the ground slope, you can take a standard spirit level, mark 1 metre in from one end with a pen and measure the fall distance as shown below.



- Draw the ground slope in each elevation box provided on our site measure form. Show and dimension any irregularities in the ground, including flat spots or hollows and mark the angle of the slope as below.
